MOTION OF THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE FOR ACCEPTANCE OF  
LATE-FILED RESPONSE TO INTERROGATORY OF DAVID POPKIN [DBP/USPS-46]  
(June 15, 2005)

The United States Postal Service hereby moves for late acceptance of its response to the above-listed interrogatory filed today. The response was due to have been filed on May 13, 2005. The filing of the response 33 calendar days late is a consequence of an internal misunderstanding regarding the source of responsibility for production of the response and the exercise of insufficient oversight to ensure its timely production. The Postal Service regrets the delay in the filing of the response, but considers that any prejudice is minimized by the narrow substantive scope of the question.
