MOTION FOR LATE ACCEPTANCE OF THE
RESPONSE OF THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE
TO INTERROGATORY OF DAVID B. POPKIN
(DBP/USPS-147)
(July 1, 2005)

The United States Postal Service hereby moves for late acceptance of its institutional response to interrogatory DBP/USPS-147. The Postal Service originally objected to this interrogatory on June 17, and Mr. Popkin moved to compel a response on June 20. On June 27, the Postal Service moved for permission to file its reply to Mr. Popkin's motion to compel three days late, or on June 30. The Postal Service has now decided to file a response to this interrogatory, rendering Mr. Popkin's motion to compel moot. This response, however, comes a day after June 30. This delay was due to the need for internal consultations. The Postal Service believes that no party has been prejudiced.
