The United States Postal Service hereby moves for late acceptance of its institutional responses to interrogatories DBP/USPS-158 and 168. The response to DBP/USPS-158 was due on June 24, but was delayed until now because of the need to prepare for hearings, the need to participate in those hearings, and the need for internal consultations with individuals not focused on this rate case. The Postal Service regrets the delay. The response to DBP/USPS-168, meanwhile, was due on June 30, but was delayed until now due to the need to compile the requested data and consult with individuals not focused on this rate case. The Postal Service regrets the delay, but could not complete its response until today.
