The United States Postal Service hereby moves for late acceptance of its institutional response to interrogatory DBP/USPS-194. This response was initially delayed due to the large number of interrogatories that undersigned counsel was dealing with during the period for hearings, along with the need for consultations with individuals not focused on this rate case; it was then further delayed by the Postal Service's decision to file a revised response to DFC/USPS-76. The Postal Service regrets the delay, but does not believe that any party has been materially prejudiced.
