In addition, the Postal Service invites the Commission’s attention to page 6627 at line 24. The transcript seems to suggest that witness Kiefer ended his statement in mid-sentence, since it reflects a statement of the Chairman from that point onward. That may be an accurate reflection of what transpired. Witness Kiefer is unable to recall whether he uttered any words after the word “where --” on line 24, but is modest enough to confess that any such words not reflected in the transcript would not add materially to the record. Accordingly, the Postal Service has no objection to a correction to line 24 by the Commission that merely identifies that the Chairman is speaking after “where --”.
