MOTION OF THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE FOR LATE ACCEPTANCE OF
THE FILING OF THE RESPONSE OF WITNESS SHAH
TO INTERROGATORY OF THE OFFICE OF THE CONSUMER ADVOCATE
(OCA/USPS-T1-13)
(June 6, 2006)

The United States Postal Service hereby moves that its filing of the response of witness Shah to OCA interrogatory OCA/USPS-T1-13 be accepted today, 74 calendar days late. The delay initially resulted from witness Shah's extended absence from work during February and March. In the mean time, as reflected in the belated response to the interrogatory, much of the requested information has since been provided in response to an earlier Presiding Officer's Information Request and during the April 28th technical conference. The Postal Service regrets the delay in the preparation of this response, but believes that any prejudice has been mitigated by the intervening provision of responsive information.
