THIRD NOTICE OF THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE REGARDING  
THE STATUS OF OUTSTANDING DISCOVERY RESPONSES  
(June 23, 2006)

The United States Postal Service hereby submits this third status report to follow-up on matters in its June 21<sup>st</sup> status report.

The Postal Service anticipated filing a copy of documents related to its AMP Public Input Process today in a Library Reference, until it was discovered this morning that the copy provided to counsel on Wednesday contained a material omission. Attempts to track down the only two employees with access to the source document revealed that both are out of the office today, but are expected to return on Monday. The Postal Service expects to rectify the omission Monday and file the Library Reference then.

Those employees also are responsible for shepherding the draft RDC Communications Plan through the internal document clearance process. As indicated earlier, final clearance is imminent. However, because of the absence of the aforementioned employees, counsel has been unable to obtain further updated information. A similar situation exists with respect to the RDC Planning Concept document. The employee with primary responsibility for progress on the project also is out of the office today. Counsel will provide a further update on both documents Monday the 26<sup>th</sup>.

Draft responses to the bulk of POIR 4 Question 7 are in production. Responses are expected to be filed next week.

Materials responses to APWU/USPS-T1-9(a-d,f) were delivered to counsel this afternoon, but consist of voluminous files that need to be printed, collated, and burned to CD-ROM. These documents will be filed no later than Tuesday the 27<sup>th</sup>.
