The United States Postal Service hereby moves for late acceptance of its filing today of the responses of witness Taufique to the following interrogatories of American Postal Workers Union: APWU/USPS-T32-1 through 12. The responses were due to have been filed on July 28<sup>th</sup>, two working days and four calendar days ago. Necessary consultations could not be completed in time for the responses to be filed on the 28<sup>th</sup>.
