RMI/USPS-T26-1. In your testimony at p. 11, beginning at line 19 you state that “An important variation of electronic notification processing is the “OneCode ACS” environment, which will be available to UAA letters that contain the so-called 4-state barcode.” Also, at p. 7, line 22-23 you state that “In USPS-LR-L-62, the PARS FY 2004 environment is used as a point of reference from which to project the TY 2008 UAA processing system.” Our questions are:

1. What was the date of the first test/pilot for the OneCode^{ACS} and what was the history (timeline) of planning for this test?
2. Given the postal services announcement on July 7th, 2006 in the *Federal Registry*, that they will no longer honor temporary mail forwarding beyond six months, what will be impact on the projected number of first class, UAA mail?
