¹ Most of these proposed corrections simply involve capitalization of subclass names: for example, "within county" is corrected to "Within County". Since the capitalization does clarify the fact that Dr. Czigler's oral testimony involved specific subclasses, when these same words could easily be used without intending a subclass reference, the corrections are appropriate. Also identified as corrections are changes from "in county" to "Within County". Since the former reflects a commonly used nickname for the subclass, an alternative form of correction would be from "in county" to "In County".
