The United States Postal Service hereby objects to interrogatories DFC/USPS-T1-19-22, filed by Douglas F. Carlson on April 5, 2007. These interrogatories, reproduced below, neither pertain, nor purport to pertain to any issue material to this proceeding, which concerns the establishment of classifications and fees for Premium Stamped Stationery and Cards.

DFC/USPS-T1-21. Please provide the location of every Automated Postal Center.

DFC/USPS-T1-22. Please provide the total number of Automated Postal Centers in service and the plans, if any, for installing additional APC's.
