FINAL REPORT OF THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE  
ON THE STATUS OF SETTLEMENT DISCUSSIONS  
AND PROPOSED ADDITIONAL PROCEDURAL DEADLINES  
(April 20, 2007)

The United States Postal Service hereby files its final report to the Commission on the status of settlement discussions in this docket. Based on the results of discussions that were ongoing until earlier this week, a negotiated settlement will not be forthcoming.

Accordingly, the Postal Service proposes the following additional procedural deadlines, in addition to those ordered by the Chairman at the pre-hearing conference, Tr. 1/4.

Postal Service motion for receipt into evidence of the witness's testimony with declaration	April 27
Participants' designation of responses to written cross-examination for inclusion in the record	April 30
Filing of witness's declaration for the designated responses	May 1

The participants have authorized undersigned counsel to state that they have no objections to the schedule, with two conditions. The first is that the Postal Service provide timely answers to outstanding interrogatories, which the Postal Service sees no impediment to doing. The second is that the Commission allow for the designation of

any answers filed subsequent to the deadline for designations, should that circumstance ensue, which seems to be congruent with normal procedures.
