- (6) Memorandum from M. Richard Porras to Mr. Dowling, Identification Code Sort (ICS) and Pilot Development of Commitment Management-Integrated Operations Management (CM-IOM) Decision Analysis Report (DAR), July 6, 1998.

These reports and memoranda are being designated as a library reference to facilitate their use by interested participants in this proceeding, in accordance with Rule 31(b)(2)(ii) and (iii) of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure, and under the protective conditions set forth in the Presiding Officer's Ruling Granting Motion for Protective Conditions issued on May 2, 2007. See PO Ruling No. MC2007-1/4. Additionally, the Postal Service emphasizes the following:

- 1) the purpose of the reports and memoranda is not to determine rates or manage operations, but rather to decide whether to make a financial commitment;

2) the Postal Service submits that the only portions responsive to the document production request in part (a) of APWU/USPS-T1-1 are found on page 12 of DAR 1, page 11 of DAR 2, and page 6 of DAR 3, and any portions of the memoranda discussing the same. The remainder of the documents is not responsive to the request. The Postal Service is providing the entire copy of the documents; however, commercially sensitive information in the nonresponsive portions of the documents has been redacted.
