ORDER GRANTING POSTAL SERVICE MOTION AND
ADDRESSING RELATED PROCEDURAL MATTERS

(June 13, 2007)

This Order addresses three matters related to completing this case. First, following the Service's report that settlement did not appear to be likely, the Commission allowed other participants until May 31, 2007 to file testimony, a brief or a formal statement in this case.¹ As no submissions have been filed, there is no need for further action in this regard.

Second, the Service has filed two copies of the direct testimony of Broderick A. Parr (USPS-T-1), along with an original signed declaration from the witness attesting to the authenticity and accuracy of the written direct testimony.² That testimony is admitted into evidence.

Third, the Service filed a conditional motion for waiver of certain data filing requirements at the outset of this case.³ Given procedural developments, the Waiver Motion is deemed moot.

These actions having been taken, the evidentiary record in this case is closed.

It is ordered:

1. The Motion of the United States Postal Service for Designation into the Evidentiary Record of the Written Direct Testimony of Broderick A. Parr, filed May 31, 2007, is granted.
2. The Postal Service's Conditional Motion for Waiver of certain filing requirements, contained in Statement of the United States Postal Service Concerning Compliance with Filing Requirements and Conditional Motion for Waiver, filed April 2, 2007, is deemed moot.
3. The evidentiary record in this case is closed.
