RESPONSE OF WITNESS YORGEY TO INTERROGATORY OF
THE AMERICAN POSTAL WORKERS UNION, AFL-CIO
(APWU/USPS-T1-5)

The United States Postal Service hereby moves for late acceptance of the response of witness Yorgey to the following interrogatory of the American Postal Workers Union, AFL-CIO (APWU), filed on October 16, 2007: APWU/USPS-T1-5. This interrogatory response was due on October 30, 2007.

The response to this interrogatory was delayed because of the need to verify the volume figures, which required reconciling Postal Service data with data from Life Line Screening. This process also necessitated consultation with Life Line Screening's mail service provider, which is not normally focused on this docket. In addition, the higher-than-expected volume figure prompted discussions between the Postal Service and Life Line Screening regarding FY 2008-2010 forecasts and Life Line Screening's business plans, which needed to be completed before the Postal Service could file a complete answer to this interrogatory.

The Postal Service regrets the delay in responding to this interrogatory, but believes that any prejudice caused by such a delay is minimal.
