



Commission to explain why opening up the mailbox raises fundamental security problems that would tend to encourage senders of credit cards and other sensitive materials, such as DFS, to cease using mail as a preferred distribution channel. We would suggest that the Commission also show why opening the mailbox would tend to increase postal rates by introducing a sortation element to the carrier function. Lastly, in terms of six day delivery and small post offices, we urge the Commission's in its report to disclose any hypothesized savings projections that would be reaped by cutting a day of delivery, and by closing small rural post offices.
