MOTION OF THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE FOR EXTENSION OF  
TIME IN WHICH TO FILE MAIL CLASSIFICATION SCHEDULE LANGUAGE  
(JANUARY 15, 2009)

The Postal Service respectfully moves to extend the time for the filing of mail classification schedule language for certain services, currently due on January 21, 2009, to February 17, 2009. Order No. 154, issued on December 19, 2009, directed the Postal Service to file classification language for the ten services that the Commission deemed to be nonpostal products and for which the Postal Service had not previously filed language.<sup>1</sup> The Order directed the Postal Service to file the requested language in 30 days, and also to file a proceeding under 39 U.S.C. 3642 for the services found to be postal services in 60 days, or February 17. The Postal Service's requested extension would align both response times to 60 days after the date of Order No. 154.

Developing the requested classification language requires extensive cross-functional consultation with numerous managers, consultations that were delayed due to absences during the holiday period. The Postal Service does not believe that anyone will be prejudiced by the 30 day extension.

<sup>1</sup> The ten services at issue are MoverSource, philatelic sales, affiliates for website, affiliates—other (linking only), FedEx drop box, licensing other than Officially Licensed Retail Products, meter manufacturers marketing program, non-sale lease agreements (non-governmental), training facilities, and warranty repair program.

For the foregoing reasons, the Postal Service moves for an extension of time for the filing of the classification language to February 17, 2009.
