On June 1, 2009, the contract at issue in this proceeding and supporting documents establishing compliance with 39 U.S.C. § 3633 and 39 C.F.R. § 3015.5 were filed under seal with the Commission, although a redacted copy of the contract and certified statement required by 39 C.F.R. § 3015.5(c)(2) were filed as Attachments 1 and 2 to the public notice.¹ In accordance with 39 C.F.R. § 3011.1(c), the Postal Service hereby gives notice that it has filed revised information under seal to substitute for information previously filed under seal in this docket. Further, as a result of this revision, the information provided in the certification filed on June 1, 2009, has changed, requiring the filing of an updated certification. The redacted version of the revised certification is filed as an attachment to this notice.

The Postal Service requests that the Commission replace the original documents with the revised information under seal. Further, the Postal Service respectfully



Certification of Prices for the Global Expedited Package Services Contract with
[REDACTED]

I, W. Ashley Lyons, Manager, Regulatory Reporting and Costing Analysis, Finance Department, United States Postal Service, am familiar with the prices for the Global Expedited Package Services Contract with [REDACTED]. The prices contained in this Contract were established by the Decision of the Governors of the United States Postal Service on the Establishment of Prices and Classifications for Global Expedited Package Services Contracts, issued May 6, 2008 (Governors' Decision No. 08-7), which established prices by means of price floor and ceiling formulas.

I hereby certify that the numerical [REDACTED] values underlying the prices in the [REDACTED] Contract are the appropriate [REDACTED] to use in the formulas and represent the best available information. The prices, resulting in a [REDACTED] coverage of [REDACTED] percent for the applicable prices, exclusive of pickup on demand and international ancillary services fees, are in compliance with 39 U.S.C § 3633 (a)(1), (2), and (3). The prices demonstrate that the Agreement should cover its attributable costs and preclude the subsidization of competitive products by market dominant products. In Fiscal Year 2008, all international competitive mail accounted for approximately [REDACTED] percent of the total contribution by all competitive products. Contribution from Global Expedited Package Services Contracts should be much smaller. The Agreement with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] should not impair the ability of competitive products on the whole to cover an appropriate share of institutional costs.
