PRESIDING OFFICER'S RULING
GRANTING MOTIONS FOR LATE ACCEPTANCE

(Issued October 16, 2009)

For proper case management, this ruling grants six motions for late acceptance that were unopposed, but have not previously been resolved by a ruling. For each of its six motions, the Postal Service states that it needs the extra business days for cross-functional consultations that could not be completed earlier.¹

None involve delay that appears unreasonable under the circumstances and there appears to be no prejudice to any participant from granting these requests.

RULING

1. The Motion of the United States Postal Service for Late Acceptance of Its Response to GFL/USPS-63, filed August 19, 2009, is granted.
2. The Motion of the United States Postal Service for Late Acceptance of Its Responses to GFL/USPS-32-33, 38, 58, 65, filed August 26, 2009, is granted.

¹ Every subsequent motion for late acceptance should, at minimum, clearly reflect both the original date that the filing or action was due, and the reason that a specified number of additional days is required beyond the due date.

3. The Motion of the United States Postal Service for Late Acceptance of Its Responses to GFL/USPS-45-47, filed August 28, 2009, is granted.
4. The Motion of the United States Postal Service for Late Acceptance of Its Responses to GFL/USPS-9 and 78, filed September 25, 2009, is granted.
5. The Motion of the United States Postal Service for Late Acceptance of Its Responses to GFL/USPS-90-91, filed October 7, 2009, is granted.
6. The Motion of the United States Postal Service for Late Acceptance of Its Response to GFL/USPS-185, filed October 15, 2009, is granted.
