The Postal Service has today filed responses to several discovery responses of GameFly, Inc. under seal: GFL/USPS-98, 101, 118, 121, 130, 138, 140, 154, 187, 197, 202, and 210. First, GFL/USPS-98, 118, 121, 140, 187, 197, 202, and 210 either ask questions that are predicated on documents that the Postal Service considers to be confidential due to the fact that they are internal documents regarding a specific customer, or require responses that provide specific details regarding the processing of a single customer's mail. Second, GFL/USPS-101, 130, and 138 are either predicated on internal Postal Service documents, or have elicited information about internal Postal Service activities or documents regarding DVD mail processing. Third, GFL/USPS-154 asks for extensive information regarding an ongoing, and internal, Postal Service project.

The Postal Service considers this customer-specific and internal information inherently confidential, for the reasons discussed in the pleading it filed on October 19, 2009. See Opposition of the United States Postal Service to

the Motion of GameFly, Inc. to Unseal Certain Documents Produced in  
Discovery. The Postal Service hereby incorporates that document by reference.
