NOTICE OF THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE
OF FILING RESPONSES TO GAMEFLY INTERROGATORIES
AND APPLICATION FOR NONPUBLIC STATUS OF THOSE RESPONSES
(GFL/USPS-94-95, 102)
(November 4, 2009)

The Postal Service is today filing responses to several interrogatories of GameFly, Inc. under seal: GFL/USPS-94-95, and 102, all filed on September 18, 2009. (Why responses to these interrogatories are being filed 33 days late is addressed in the accompanying motion for late acceptance.) These interrogatories request mailer-specific information for each of Netflix, Blockbuster and GameFly: average FY08 outbound postage per piece (94); average FY08 inbound postage per piece (95); and average FY05 through FY08 inbound weight per piece.

Given the inherent sensitivity of mailer-specific volumes and weights, the responses warrant, and the Commission normally extends, nonpublic treatment. The Postal Service considers such information to be confidential, for the reasons discussed in the pleading it filed on October 19, 2009. See Opposition of the United States Postal Service to the Motion of GameFly, Inc. to Unseal Certain

Documents Produced in Discovery. The Postal Service hereby incorporates that document by reference.

Each response consists of two or three paragraphs discussing the procedure used to calculate requested estimates, including assumptions that enabled estimation, followed by a brief table. Only values in the tables are redacted from the public responses.
