APPLICATION OF THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE
CONCERNING NONPUBLIC STATUS OF ITS
RESPONSES TO DISCOVERY REQUESTS OF GAMEFLY, INC.
(GFL/USPS-103, 105, 193, 211)
(November 4, 2009)

The Postal Service has today filed responses to several discovery responses of GameFly, Inc. under seal: GFL/USPS-103, 105, 193, and 211. First, GFL/USPS-103 and 105 ask questions that are predicated on documents that are properly considered confidential due to the fact that they are either a specific communication between an individual customer and the Postal Service, or reflect detailed information concerning the internal processing accorded to an individual customer. The first of these questions also ask for details regarding the interaction between the Postmaster General and a specific customer. Second, GFL/USPS-211 asks detailed questions regarding the service provided to an individual customer, and requires a discussion of that customer's distribution network. Finally, GFL/USPS-193 requires an answer that identifies a specific customer.

The Postal Service considers this customer-specific information inherently confidential, for the reasons discussed in the pleading it filed on October 19, 2009. See Opposition of the United States Postal Service to the Motion of

GameFly, Inc. to Unseal Certain Documents Produced in Discovery. The Postal Service hereby incorporates that document by reference.
