ORDER GRANTING REQUEST TO DEFER FILING OF DATA

(Issued December 10, 2009)

Rule 3050.2(d), 39 CFR 3050.2(d), affords the Postal Service an opportunity to seek the Commission's permission to defer the filing of non-time critical periodic reporting documentation for up to two weeks beyond the date it would otherwise be due. On November 30, 2009, the Postal Service filed a request under rule 3050.2(d) to defer filing documentation for two items that it plans to include in its Annual Compliance Report for FY 2009.¹

The Postal Service requests that it be allowed to defer the filing of documentation of the computer programs that it uses to implement the incremental cost model required by rule 3050.23. *Id.* at 1-2. It also requests that it be allowed to defer the SAS logs and programs that disaggregate Segment 3 mail processing costs into cost pools. The

Postal Service explains that it hopes to file the necessary SAS documentation with the FY 2009 ACR, but is requesting permission to defer it as a precaution, in the event that it is unable to complete the documentation on time. *Id.* at 2-3.

The Request is granted. The Commission notes that the SAS documentation of the mail processing cost pools is likely to be time critical and urges the Postal Service to file that documentation as promptly as possible.

The Request of the United States Postal Service for Leave to Defer Portions of the FY09 ACR Documentation, filed November 30, 2009, is granted.
