Dear Postal Regulatory Commission,

First, please let me apologize on the late date of submission, but because of the terrible storms we have had, we were out of electricity for days, therefore, no computer.

Our Post Office, Leon, VA 22725 was Temporary Suspended because of eviction.. This was not true, I have enclosed as a PDF file the history of this negotiation. I did not want Leon, VA closed. I put my heart and soul into renovating this landmark and also a good part of my bank account. The USPS was in contact with me two years before the contract would expire. So it wasn't something that happened over night. I even had a signed contract.

As of this date, we have not received from the District Manager, a Letter stating what is going to happen to our post office. Will it be closed or reopened?

We object to this Temporary suspension because it is really a closing without giving us our rights according to Title 39. We should have had 60 days to object and 30 days to contact the PRC. We also object for the following reasons:

1. Not given much notice
2. Not given much notice on Community Meeting
3. Although we submitted a petition with over 3 pages of signatures, there was no response.

As you can see from the photographs, they destroyed the "ideal small rural Post Office". In addition, they stripped the entire old oak facade that I had purchased from Mr. Golightly in 1998.

I want to thank the Postal Regulatory Commission for allowing me to express my dissatisfaction on the way the Leon, VA Post Office was closed and is still closed.
