MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE  
REQUEST OF THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE  
TO ADD STAMP FULFILLMENT SERVICES TO THE MAIL CLASSIFICATION  
SCHEDULE IN RESPONSE TO ORDER NO. 391  
(March 15, 2010)

Order No. 391 (January 13, 2010) ordered the Postal Service to file a request to add Stamp Fulfillment Services to the Mail Classification Schedule (MCS). Order No. 391 states that,

Should the Postal Service propose the use of simplified shipping fees as an alternative to tariff postage that would, of course, itself require the Postal Service to file an appropriate request to add SFS to the MCS product lists. Pending receipt of any such proposal, the Commission reaffirms its findings in Order No. 154, and the Postal Service is authorized to continue to charge a \$1.00 handling fee. The continued collection of the handling fee, however, requires the filing of a request to add SFS to the Market Dominant Product List. That filing is due within 60 days from the date of this Order.

Order No. 391 at 15.

Because of concerns that the \$1.00 fee may not be adequate to cover costs for Stamp Fulfillment Services, the Postal Service has not been able to complete a filing to add SFS to the Market Dominant Product List by today's deadline. The Postal Service needs additional time to determine what proposal to make, and obtain management and

Governors' review. The Postal Service therefore requests an extension of time, until April 30, 2010, in which to complete its filing to add Stamp Fulfillment Services to the Mail Classification Schedule.
