DFC/USPS-18. Please refer to the response to DFC/USPS-T4-9.

- a. Please confirm that an outbound First-Class Mail International letter mailed in San Francisco and destined to Tokyo, Japan, will be transported to the New York JFK ISC and then to Tokyo. If you do not confirm, please explain.
- b. Please confirm that, in 2008, an outbound First-Class Mail International letter mailed in San Francisco and destined to Tokyo, Japan, would have been dispatched from San Francisco to Tokyo.
- c. Please identify the extent to which delivery times for outbound First-Class Mail International letters and flats have increased as a result of the decision to route this mail through the New York JFK ISC.
- d. Please identify the service area of each ISC.

DFC/USPS-19. Please refer to the response to DFC/USPS-T4-9. If the Postal Service implements the plan that it proposes in this docket, will the New York JFK ISC continue to process outbound international mail on weekends to the same extent as it does now?

DFC/USPS-20. Please estimate the costs that could be saved if the Postal Service implemented the plan that it proposes in this docket and also did not deliver mail to post office boxes on Saturdays.
