ORDER ON MOTION TO SHOW CAUSE

(May 10, 2010)

Attached to the Public Representatives' comments were two non-public exhibits containing information which was provided by the Postal Service.¹ Subsequently, the Public Representatives filed a motion seeking an explanation from the Postal Service as to why the two exhibits should not be made public.² On March 24, 2010, the Postal Service filed a response indicating that it did not contest the public release of the

information except for the number of customers served by a particular postal facility (customer counts).³ The Public Representatives withdrew their request in regards to the customer counts, and request that the remaining information in Exhibit F and all information in Exhibit H, which contains no customer counts information, be made public.⁴

The parties' pleadings resolve the issue of what information may be filed publicly. The Public Representatives may, in their discretion, re-file Exhibits F and H as public documents, excluding customer counts information. Prior to such filing, the Public Representatives shall confirm with the Postal Service that the revised exhibits do not include any non-public customer counts information.

It is ordered:

The Public Representatives may re-file Exhibit F and Exhibit H as public documents as set forth in this Order.
