MOTION OF THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE
FOR LATE ACCEPTANCE OF FILING OF ITS RESPONSE
TO QUESTION 1 OF CHAIRMAN'S INFORMATION REQUEST NO. 3
(May 20, 2010)

The United States Postal Service hereby moves for late acceptance today of the filing of its responses to Question 1 of Chairman's Information Request No. 3. The response was due on May 14, 2010, and is six calendar and four business days late. The delay in filing related to difficulties in assembling relevant data and coordinating among key personnel, including consultations regarding how best to split the responses between operations and costing personnel. Unexpected absences also delayed progress, and the final day of the delay (which is only partial, as the overnight filing should allow the response to be posted at the start of the business day on May 20) was simply to format the aggregate input, which was attempted but could not be

accomplished by the 4:30 pm filing deadline on May 19. The Postal Service regrets the delay, but considers it unlikely that any party has suffered any prejudice as a result.
