The United States Postal Service hereby responds to the following interrogatory of David B. Popkin, filed on April 13, 2010.

DBP/USPS-25

The Postal Service objected to the interrogatory on April 23, 2010. Mr. Popkin filed a motion to compel a response on May 6, 2010, and the Postal Service filed an opposition to that motion on May 13, 2010. On May 18, 2010, the Presiding Officer denied, in part, Mr. Popkin's motion, and directed the Postal Service to file a response to DBP/USPS-25 with "nationwide cumulative data," but without "a listing of the name and ZIP Code of each office granted a waiver."
