CHAIRMAN'S INFORMATION REQUEST NO. 3

(Issued May 25, 2010)

To clarify the basis of the Postal Service's proposal and to assist in the completion of the record, the Postal Service is requested to provide written responses to the following questions. Answers are due no later than June 1, 2010.

1. The Postal Service proposes a separate charge for fulfilling postage stamp orders and philatelic sales. See Docket No. MC2010-24. However, in Docket No. MC2008-1, the Postal Service indicated that it often cannot distinguish philatelic purchases from regular stamp purchases.
 - (a) Please explain how the Postal Service plans to distinguish philatelic sales revenues from postage stamp sales revenues.
 - (b) Please explain how the Postal Service will allocate revenues and expenses between Stamp Fulfillment Services and Philatelic Sales products for combined orders for stamps and philatelic items.
2. The Postal Service's proposed Mail Classification Schedule (MCS) language states that "Stamp Fulfillment Services provides the fulfillment of stamp orders placed by mail, phone, fax or online to the Stamp Fulfillment Services

organization.”¹ Does the Postal Service intend the term “stamp orders” as used in the proposed MCS language to “include stamps, stamped cards, envelopes, and stationery”, as suggested by the Postal Service? Request at 2.
