MOTION OF THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE FOR LATE ACCEPTANCE OF
THE FILING OF RESPONSES TO INTERROGATORIES
OF THE PUBLIC REPRESENTATIVE REDIRECTED FROM WITNESS PULCRANO
(PR/USPS-T1-10 THROUGH T1-13)

The United States Postal Service hereby moves that the Commission accept for filing nine calendar days late its institutional responses to the above-listed interrogatories of the Public Representative.

The responses were due to have been filed on May 26, 2010 – seven business days ago. The press of other postal business prevented the compilation and review of responsive information until May 28th. Internal administrative problems, which could not be resolved until the middle of this week, further prevented the filing of the responses.

To minimize any prejudice to the Public Representative, the Postal Service informally transmitted copies of the responses to the Public Representative on May 28th. The Postal Service regrets the cumulative delay in the formal filing of these responses, but believes that any resulting prejudice has been kept to a minimum.
