RESPONSE OF UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE
TO INTERROGATORY OF DAVID B. POPKIN

DBP/USPS-69 Please refer to your response to Interrogatory DBP/USPS-26 subparts [b] and [c].

Please provide a best estimate of the desired data.

RESPONSE:

The Postal Service's data systems do not provide a way to determine which collection boxes are in front of city versus non-city post offices. While these city boxes should be picked up at 5:00 pm or later on weekdays, and at 1:00 pm or later on Saturdays (based on the POM), data already provided to the questioner shows that less than 100 percent are picked up at those times. How much less is unknown, and a meaningful estimate is not possible.

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DBP/USPS-70 Please refer to your response to Interrogatory DBP/USPS-26 subpart [d].

Please confirm, or explain if you are unable to confirm, that any failures to adhere to the national policy as stated in POM 322.23 are not condoned by USPS Headquarters.

RESPONSE:
