Is it your belief that the postal delivery of election ballots addressed to a Post Office Box will be affected by the elimination of postal delivery to street addresses on Saturdays?

RESPONSE:

My understanding of the proposal is that delivery of election ballots addressed to a Post Office Box will not be directly affected by elimination of postal delivery to street addresses on Saturdays in the sense that the Postal Service's proposal retains delivery to post office boxes. However, to the extent that the elimination of Saturday street delivery could delay delivery of election materials, including ballots, to voters or could delay the mailing of a ballot from a voter who otherwise might place the ballot (i) in his or her home mail box or receptacle for carrier pickup or (ii) in a collection box, there could be an indirect effect.
