PRESIDING OFFICER'S RULING
CORRECTING TRANSCRIPT VOLUME 24

On April 1, 1998, the Postal Service filed a notice concerning the response to interrogatory USPS/PSA-T1-34 directed to witness Jellison.¹ The Postal Service notice indicates that the response included at Tr. 24/13039-40 is the original response provided by witness Jellison, not the revised response which was filed on February 18, 1998. The Postal Service requests that the transcript be corrected to reflect the revised interrogatory response. I will grant the Postal Service request.

whether USPS carries more or fewer under one pound parcels than, for example, United Parcel Service. Thus we do not know whether one carrier dominates the actual under one pound market. In our view "dominance" would reflect market shares of the same magnitude that United Parcel Service has of the one pound and over market.

- (c) I do not know.
- (d) The current maximum rate possible would be 84.3 cents per piece.
- (e) We have no information on what rates are actually paid for the shipment of parcels of any weight by UPS. The published UPS tariff is a meaningless document.
- (f) Yes.
