PARTICIPANT STATEMENT

1. Petitioner(s) are appealing the Postal Service's Final Determination concerning the Pleasant Ridge post office. The Final Determination was posted ? (date) Not Posted.

2. In accordance with applicable law, 39 U.S.C. § 404(b)(5), the Petitioner(s) request the Postal Regulatory Commission to review the Postal Service's determination on the basis of the record before the Postal Service in the making of the determination.

I believe the Final Determination to close the Pleasant Ridge Station should be reversed and returned to the Postal Service for further consideration because of the following reasons:

- 1) This Post Office is part of the 400,000 sq. ft. Pleasant Ridge Town Center, repeatedly recognized as the most prestigious center in Arkansas. It is place where the surrounding neighbors, many of whom walk, can take care of every need in a 1 mile radius. They really have no reason to leave the area. Every service and need is provided in this one location and the Post Office is one of those important services that make it a true "town center". It is surrounded by well established neighborhoods, churches, schools and office complexes. Besides the many who walk to the Post Office and surrounding businesses, a recent traffic count (exhibit 1) shows that it serves 6,000+ customers weekly who drive.
- 2) The Postal Service states that there has been "minimal growth in the area in recent years". It also claims that the area consists of "small businesses". At least 45 new businesses have opened in the last 4 years, of which Belk and The Fresh Market can hardly be classified as "small". When the Post Office opened in 1996, there were 3 businesses and 500 apartments. Today there are 134 businesses and 800 apartments surrounding the Post Office and there is triple the amount of traffic on Cantrell and Pleasant Ridge Road. If an area such as this does not need a Postal Office, it would be hard to think of one that does. See exhibits 2a & 2b, aerials of the Pleasant Ridge Town Center.
- 3) A "Proposal" to Close/Consolidate was not posted in the Post Office with a 60 day "Opportunity for patron comments".
- 4) 72212 zip customers received a questionnaire intended for Fort Smith on November 12/13, 2009. After the error was detected, the questionnaires were reissued and I received the proper one on November 19, 2009. This obviously caused some confusion since most who received them had no idea the Postal Service was considering the closure, however the deadline for submitting the questionnaire remained November 27, 2009. Out of 6,044 questionnaires distributed, 4,746 were unaccounted for. This was probably due to confusion and inadequate turnaround time.
- 5) When the Chenal Station was opened MANY homes and businesses in the 72212 zip code were changed to the 72223 zip code. These homes/businesses are literally across the street within a stones throw of the Pleasant Ridge Station. These are a lot of our walkers. They have NEVER used the Chenal Station, unless they have been forced to drive there to pick up packages. These are all persons served by the Pleasant Ridge Station every week and NONE of these customers have ever received notices or surveys regarding the closure of this facility. The Postal Service states that Questionnaires were available "over the counter". My office is next door and there were never questionnaires available in the Post Office.

- 6) The "Final Determination" was not posted at the facility for 60 days or any days. There was nothing at the facility to instruct the public on how to appeal or express their comments. (A letter was mailed with a date of February 4, 2011 stating the facility would close on March 26, 2011, which also does not meet the 60 day requirement. Nothing in the letter instructed how to appeal or express views and the letter did not include any required findings.) See exhibit 3.
- 7) The Postal Service states more than once that the Westside Station is .53 miles away, when it is actually a 2.3 mile one-way trip.
- 8) Last but certainly not least, the economic savings to the Postal Service is extremely questionable. The original annual savings quoted on the Questionnaire Analysis was \$372,625. In the Notice of the United States Postal Service dated March 2, 2011, the annual savings were quoted to be \$296,906. Of course this is after spending \$488,256. to modify the Westside Station. Their numbers are unsupported and I believe that any real savings is non-existent. On the other hand, the cost to the public is obvious. 300,000+ trips per year X \$30 per trip = \$9,000,000. To make matters worse, these unnecessary trips will be made on streets that are already extremely burdened with traffic.

I request that the PRC suspend the closure of the Pleasant Ridge Station. When these decisions to close our postal facilities are made in such a cavalier fashion, it is certainly a sad day for our Country, City and Community.





Dear Postal Customer,

This is to inform you of the ~~U.S. Postal Service's~~ decision to close the Little Rock Pleasant Ridge Station located at 11619 Pleasant Ridge Road. We advised you in November, 2009, of our intent to conduct a feasibility study and the final decision has been made. This office will be open and operational until March 26, 2011.

Because of the drastic decline in mail volume, the Postal Service is in a fiscal crisis and must take action to reduce the size of its retail and delivery network. By consolidating, streamlining and adjusting our operations, the Postal Service becomes a more efficient and effective organization.

The community's input was received and carefully considered before making the final decision. Ultimately, based on all of the factors involved, the decision was made to proceed with the closure.
