
**REQUEST FOR ORAL ARGUMENTS per & 3001.16**

## PETITION FOR REVIEW

**1. Notice:** The FCMC was not given notice of this closure, as an interested party, per Section & 3001.110 despite having served notice on the Postal Service as an interested party. (exhibit 2 & 3)

Postal Service notice provide to Post Office Box holder, is deficient, per & 3001.110 , “this notice must include a provision stating that, pursuant to Pub L. 94-421, a final Postal Service determination to close or consolidate a post office may be appealed to the Postal Regulatory Commission....” (exhibit 1)

**2. Written Determination** Postal Service has not issued a written determination for closing and has not provided a written response to prior correspondences from FCMC. ( exhibit 2 & 3) Postal Service has not provided any written response or made any attempt to respond; despite its oral representation, to do so at the meeting held on March 25, 2009. That meeting included United States Congressman Christopher Smith.

**3. County Seat** The Closing of this facility would render Monmouth County the only County Seat without a postal office in the State of New Jersey.

**4. Confusion in ZIP Codes** It should be made clear for the record, that this Post Office serves the residents and businesses located in Freehold Borough. Freehold Borough has its own form of government (Mayor & Council), its own municipal services including Police and Fire, and full service Administration. The closing of this Post Office will leave a full service municipality without a post office.

Freehold Township is a separate municipality with its own form of government (Committee structure) and has its own municipal services including Police and Fire, and full service Administration.

While they both share the name Freehold and the same zip code (07728), that is where the similarities end. Freehold Borough experiences high pedestrian traffic. Many residents, including a large population of seniors and minority groups, do not have automobiles. In addition many of these residents are computer illiterate and cannot access postal services on the internet. The closing of this post office will deny a majority of the population of Freehold Borough the ability to access any postal services and place a substantial burden on Downtown businesses that rely on the Lafayette postal trailer.

**5. Nearest Post Office** The nearest postal facility is almost 2 miles away in Freehold Township. The Township Post Office is located adjacent to a highly congested road within a highly congested shopping center; it is poorly accessible and the customer service time is often excessive. The access road to this facility and the available parking on site are over capacity and substandard. This facility provides no pedestrian access or service by public transportation. The increased use of this facility, resulting from the closure of the Lafayette postal trailer, will cause a severe and excessive burden to the residents of both municipalities.

**6. Surrounding Municipalities with Two or More Post Offices** There are several surrounding municipalities that have two or more post offices located within their towns, with different zip codes, that do significantly less postal business. These offices continue in use and apparently have had no formal consideration of closing or consolidation.

**7. Public Law 105-241** By not providing a written report or any other form of communication to elected officials and other interested parties, the Postal Service is in violation of this Act of Congress (exhibit 4).

**8. Public Support** Please see attached resolutions of support for maintaining this facility (exhibit 5)

**9. Request for Oral Arguments** Due to the unusual circumstances, the lack of any public disclosure of a written report, and lack of communication to elected officials of the Township of Freehold, the Borough of Freehold, the County of Monmouth, the State of NJ and the office of United States Congressman Christopher Smith, oral arguments are respectfully requested.

## SUMMARY

It is respectfully requested of the Postal Regulatory Commission to:

1. Reverse the determination to close the Lafayette Postal Trailer, Freehold, NJ, 07728
2. Suspend the closing of the Lafayette Postal Trailer, Freehold, NJ, 07728 pending the outcome of this appeal to the Postal Regulatory Commission.

This is to inform you of the U.S. Postal Service's decision to close the Lafayette Trailer located at 13 Lafayette Street, Freehold NJ. We advised you in July of 2009 of our intent to conduct a feasibility study and the final decision has been made. This trailer will close at the end of business on July 29, 2011.

Because of the drastic decline in mail volume, the Postal Service is in a fiscal crisis and must take action to reduce the size of its retail and delivery network. By consolidating, streamlining and adjusting our operations, the Postal Service becomes a more efficient and effective organization.

I want to assure you that the community's input was received and carefully considered before making this decision. Ultimately, based on all of the factors involved, the decision was made to proceed with the closure.

As a Post Office box customer, you have the option of continuing your Post Office box at the Freehold Post Office located at 200 Village Center Drive. You will not be required to change your mailing address if you choose to continue your Post Office Box at the new location. Once the trailer is closed, you will be required to exchange your current box keys for the new box keys at the Freehold Post Office. You will also need to complete a new PS 1093, *Application for Post Office Box Service*. Full retail service hours at the Freehold office are from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, and 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturday. The Post Office box lobby is open from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Saturday.

Local mail delivery will not be affected by this move. Full retail services will still be available in neighboring offices and our customers will continue to receive the same excellent service they always have.



**Mr. Potter**

**I am writing to you on behalf of the Freehold Center Partnership (FCP). The FCP represents in excess of four hundred (400) business and property owners in Freehold Borough. By ordinance the FCP is empowered to enhance the downtown's economic development, and encourage its revitalization.**

**It has come to my attention that the United States Postal Service has unilaterally decided to imminently abandon its postal unit in Freehold Borough. The USPS has maintained its current facility for the past seven years and has served Freehold Borough very well.**

**This postal unit serves not only the members of the FCP, but hundreds of other professionals including lawyers, accountants, mortgage and real estate professionals. This postal unit is also patronized by heavy pedestrian traffic from within the Borough as well as by residents from the east side of Freehold Township.**

**This postal unit is located in the County Seat and services many governmental offices as well as the Monmouth County Courthouse.**

**The nearest postal facility is almost 2 miles away in Freehold Township. The Township Postal unit is located adjacent to a highly congested road within a highly congested shopping center; it is poorly accessible and the customer service time is often excessive. The access road to this facility and the available parking are over capacity. The increased use of this facility will cause a severe and excessive burden to the patrons of both facilities.**

**In closing, I question how the USPS can close a postal unit without surveying its patrons or at least holding a public hearing to discuss this proposal; and /or consider potential viable alternatives.**

**On behalf of the Freehold Center Partnership, I request your immediate intervention in this matter. The closing of this postal unit will have severe and irreversible consequences to the businesses and residents of the Borough of Freehold.**

I am writing to you today as a follow up to my letter to you of February 10, 2009 in which to date I have not received a formal response.

Subsequent to my letter, a meeting was scheduled by the Mayor of Freehold Borough in conjunction with United States Congressman Christopher Smith. This meeting occurred on or about March 25, 2009 at Town Hall. Representing the United States Postal Service was Central New Jersey District Manager Priscilla Maney and Freehold Postmaster Leonard Oaks.

Other attendees at this meeting included the Mayor of Freehold Township, the Monmouth County Freeholder Director, a representative from State Senator Jennifer Beck, State Assemblyman Declan O'Scanlon and State Assemblywoman Caroline Cassagrande and United States Congressman Christopher Smith.

I have attached my letter of February 10, 2009, in which all my concerns raised in that letter continue today. I have also attached several newspaper articles regarding this issue as well as an editorial from the Asbury Park Press.


One thing that was agreed upon by all at that meeting with the Postal officials is that they would seriously review all of the many issues raised by all the parties present, including but not limited to the inability, of the Freehold Township Postal unit to effectively handle any more postal customers. Service wait times are excessive now, and access to the building is severely limited due to parking and access configuration. All in attendance were assured by Ms. Maney that she would do a thorough review and a follow up meeting would be scheduled prior to any further action by the US Postal Service.

Yesterday, I became aware that the US Postal Service has unilaterally decided to close the postal unit located in Freehold Borough, which is the County Seat of Monmouth, on or about August 15, 2009.

105th Congress

An Act

Sept. 28, 1998  
[S. 2112]

To make the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 applicable to the United States Postal Service in the same manner as any other employer.

Postal Employees  
Safety  
Enhancement  
Act.  
39 USC 101 note.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

**SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

This Act may be cited as the "Postal Employees Safety Enhancement Act".

**SEC. 2. APPLICATION OF ACT.**

(a) **DEFINITION.**—Section 3(5) of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 (29 U.S.C. 652(5)) is amended by inserting after "the United States" the following: "(not including the United States Postal Service)".

(b) **FEDERAL PROGRAMS.**—

(1) **OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH.**—Section 19(a) of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 (29 U.S.C. 668(a)) is amended by inserting after "each Federal Agency" the following: "(not including the United States Postal Service)".

(2) **OTHER SAFETY PROGRAMS.**—Section 7902(a)(2) of title 5, United States Code, is amended by inserting after "Government of the United States" the following: "(not including the United States Postal Service)".

**SEC. 3. CLOSING OR CONSOLIDATION OF OFFICES NOT BASED ON OSHA COMPLIANCE.**

Section 404(b)(2) of title 39, United States Code, is amended to read as follows:

"(2) The Postal Service, in making a determination whether or not to close or consolidate a post office—

"(A) shall consider—

"(i) the effect of such closing or consolidation on the community served by such post office;

"(ii) the effect of such closing or consolidation on employees of the Postal Service employed at such office;

"(iii) whether such closing or consolidation is consistent with the policy of the Government, as stated in section 101(b) of this title, that the Postal Service shall provide a maximum degree of effective and regular postal services to rural areas, communities, and small towns where post offices are not self-sustaining;

"(iv) the economic savings to the Postal Service resulting from such closing or consolidation; and

“(v) such other factors as the Postal Service determines are necessary; and

“(B) may not consider compliance with any provision of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 (29 U.S.C. 651 et seq.).”.

**SEC. 4. PROHIBITION ON RESTRICTION OR ELIMINATION OF SERVICES.**

(a) **IN GENERAL.**—Chapter 4 of title 39, United States Code, is amended by adding after section 414 the following:

**“§ 415. Prohibition on restriction or elimination of services**

“The Postal Service may not restrict, eliminate, or adversely affect any service provided by the Postal Service as a result of the payment of any penalty imposed under the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 (29 U.S.C. 651 et seq.).”.

(b) **TECHNICAL AND CONFORMING AMENDMENT.**—The table of sections for chapter 4 of title 39, United States Code, is amended by adding at the end the following:

“415. Prohibition on restriction or elimination of services.”.

**SEC. 5. LIMITATIONS ON RAISE IN RATES.**

Section 3622 of title 39, United States Code, is amended by adding at the end the following:

“(c) Compliance with any provision of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 (29 U.S.C. 651 et seq.) shall not be considered by the Commission in determining whether to increase rates and shall not otherwise affect the service of the Postal Service.”.



## **--- RESOLUTION ---**

WHEREAS, Freehold Township's adjoining municipality, Freehold Borough, the Monmouth County seat, serves as the focal point of commerce, law, government, and social services for the entire County of Monmouth; and,

WHEREAS, Freehold Borough, as the Monmouth County seat, hosting a multitude of government offices and a downtown replete with businesses and restaurants, has a significant demand for postal services; and,

WHEREAS, the United States Postmaster General has issued a consolidation order which would likely result in the closure of the Freehold Borough Postal Center; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Freehold is seriously concerned with the consolidation order issued by the United States Postmaster General, as the closure of the Freehold Borough Postal Center would be a major inconvenience to local residents, businesses, senior citizens, local municipal and County government and their employees ; and,

WHEREAS, the Freehold Borough Postal Center, which consists of only a trailer, is cost-effectively managed and requires no rental or lease payment for operations since the County of Monmouth provides the land to accommodate the trailer; and,

WHEREAS, the Township of Freehold wishes to officially declare to the United States Postal Service its support of the operation of the facility in the Borough, located on Lafayette Street in the center of the downtown business area; and,

WHEREAS, closure of the Freehold Borough Postal Facility will create a hardship for many area residents who will find it difficult to avail themselves of the Raintree Facility in the Township of Freehold; and,

Dear Mr. Rudez:

During the past few weeks, I have read more than a few accounts in the media of local post offices closing throughout the country, and more particularly in New Jersey. Needless to say, I feel much angst when this type of news becomes public because our post office in the downtown area was at one time targeted for closure. Allow me to take this opportunity to restate to you a few reasons why the postal facility in Freehold Borough must remain open.

First of all, Freehold Borough is the county seat of Monmouth County. This means that Freehold Borough is the hub of much commerce and all government services. Lack of a real postal facility would result in a major disservice and a terrible inconvenience to these users, not to mention the fact that the county seat of Monmouth would be without a postal facility. (That would be the only county seat in the whole State of New Jersey that would be without one!)

Secondly, Freehold Borough is home to a significant immigrant population. This has created a significant pedestrian population. Vehicular transportation is not an option for these people, whether they are seeking medical care, food supplies, religious services, or even the post


