Dear Fellow Americans:

We hereby request an appeal and petition for review of the Final Determination to close the Enloe, Texas Post Office. Our Post Office serves an unincorporated rural community in Delta County which is located approximately 90 miles northeast of Dallas, Texas.

If you close our Post Office, you will simultaneously close our community. Our Post Office is our identity, our focal point, our potential to attract new businesses and industries. The closing of our Post Office would be devastating to our struggling community. The economic impact would potentially wipe us off the map. You will be creating a hardship for many of our residents who struggle on a daily basis to maintain their independence both financially and physically. To obtain full postal service, we will have to make a ten mile round trip to Cooper. This would create yet another financial burden which reduces our quality of life.

We have a number of handicapped and infirm folks who are able to maintain their independence by going to our Enloe Post Office. These folks are not able to drive to Cooper and if they got there, they would not be able to go inside the Cooper Post Office. The financial, physical, and mental quality of life of a vast majority of our residents will be greatly reduced if our Enloe Post Office is closed. To maintain independence is one of the blessings of life.

In the ECONOMIC SAVINGS section of the closure document, the USPS maintains that the annual savings due to closure will be \$40,841. There is no mention of the revenue generated from the rented 72 post office boxes or the revenue from the window service. It is our understanding that closures cannot be made for purely financial reasons. However, all of the reasons listed for closing our Post Office are purely financial.

We implore you to understand how very small a \$40,841 savings to the USPS is compared to the very huge devastating hardship it will create for our community. We ask you to tell us what we can do to keep our Enloe Post Office open.
