**MOTION FOR LATE ACCEPTANCE
OF OBJECTION OF THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE
TO PUBLIC REPRESENTATIVE INTERROGATORIES
PR/USPS-T3-33 THROUGH 46**

The United States Postal Service hereby moves that its objection to the above-listed interrogatories filed today be accepted two workdays (four calendar days) late. The press of other business within the scope of and related to Docket No. N2012-1, in combination with the absence last week of critical internal stakeholders, prevented postal management and counsel from completing necessary consultations last week to determine the extent to which objections based on the untimeliness of the interrogatories would be waived.

The Postal Service does not consider that any party has been materially prejudiced by its taking several additional days to determine that it would waive its objection with respect to all but one of the interrogatories.
