Monthly Progress Report on Full-Service Intelligent Mail Participation and Compliance by Commercial First-Class Mail and Standard Mail Customers (February 27, 2013)

The Postal Service previously updated the Commission on the progress of Full-Service Intelligent Mail participation and certification on January 29, 2013.

Between January 1 and February 25, 2013, the Postal Service measured over 2 billion First-Class Mail items from 765 active Full Service Intelligent Mail customers. Measured First-Class Mail items with an overnight service standard originated in 66 districts, those with a two-day service standard originated in 64 out of a possible 66 districts, and those with a three-to-five-day service standard originated in 62 districts. For Standard Mail, there were almost 2 billion items measured with origin data from all districts for Destination Entry letters and flats, 58 districts for End-to-End letters, and 48 districts for End-to-End Flats. There were over 139 million pieces measured for Periodicals delivered between January 1 and February 25, originating from all districts. For Package Services Bound Printed Matter Flats there were about 452 thousand pieces measured quarter-to-date, with origin data for 64 districts.
