**NOTICE OF THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE OF FILING ERRATA**  
(September 10, 2013)

The Postal Service hereby gives Notice of Filing Errata to its Supplement to the Administrative Record. On September 4, 2013, Petitioner Granger filed an Initial Brief in Support of Petition, in which he stated that the Final Determination posted in Fernandina Beach Downtown Station was materially different from Item No. 35.<sup>1</sup> Upon investigation, the undersigned counsel learned that Item No. 35, submitted on August 9, 2013, was an earlier draft of the Final Determination and that the only revisions were to the **responsiveness to community postal needs and economic savings sections**. The Postal Service posted the revised Final Determination, attached to this notice as Item No. 35A, in the Fernandina Beach Downtown Station on July 9, 2013. This Final Determination remains posted and available to the public. The inadvertent submission of the earlier draft of the Final Determination is inconsequential to the arguments presented in the Motion to Dismiss Proceedings. The Postal Service regrets the inconvenience, but does not believe any party is prejudiced.
