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Federal Express Corporation (“FedEx”) respectfully requests leave to file the accompanying comment in response to “Additional Comments of Netflix, Inc. Submitted Pursuant to Order No. 1827” filed on September 11, 2013. Although Order No. 1827 grants only the Postal Service the right to respond to the comments filed by parties pursuant to Order No. 1827 (i.e., comments filed in response to the Postal Service’s Reply Comments of July 26, 2013), Netflix has raised in its Additional Comment for the first time very fundamental claims regarding the scope of the U.S. postal monopoly law. While FedEx has no interest in, and expresses no opinion on, the main issue in this case, FedEx has a vital interest in the scope of the postal monopoly law. The attached comments address only the issue of the postal monopoly, and we believe that they may assist the Commission in its analysis of this threshold question. We therefore respectfully request the Commission exercise its discretion under Rule 21(b) and accept the filing of this limited comment.
