Dear Ms. Grove:

The Postal Service today is filing a very slightly revised version of a document (the Annual Report on Form 10-K) originally filed on November 15, 2013. This correction, which does not affect the substance of the report, is being made because it has come to our attention that a small amount of information appearing on two of the pages of the original report did not appear on the document as filed in pdf format. Specifically, on pages 73 and 74, representing the opinion letters of auditing firm Ernst & Young, certain text indicating the appearance of original handwritten signatures (that is, the text "/s/ Ernst & Young LLP") did not appear on the pages filed in pdf format.

For this reason, pursuant to the Postal Accountability and Enhancement Act, the Postal Service is today again filing with the Commission the following report:

Annual Report on Form 10-K "containing the information prescribed in Form 10-K of the Securities and Exchange Commission." 39 U.S.C. § 3654(a)(1)(B).

This version of the report more accurately represents the original report which was intended to be filed in pdf format back in November, complete with indications of handwritten signatures, and should be substituted for the version previously filed.
