
**SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION TO THE NOTICE OF THE UNITED STATES
POSTAL SERVICE OF RATES NOT OF GENERAL APPLICABILITY**
(October 1, 2014)

The United States Postal Service (Postal Service) hereby provides supplemental information concerning the notice of rates for Inbound EMS 2 in this docket.¹ In that docket, the Postal Service identified the rates for each tier of Inbound EMS. However, as announced in Universal Postal Union International Bureau Circular 167, which was issued on September 23, 2013, the Postal Service reserved the right to impose inbound EMS rates reciprocally when another country's inbound EMS rates for U.S. origin EMS shipments exceed the Postal Service's announced rates.² Rates for sixteen countries, as identified below in the column labeled "Reciprocal Rate in SDR", were increased as a result of this reciprocal adjustment. As a consequence, rates for those sixteen countries exceeded the maximum rates identified in the August 15, 2013 filing. This change results in the Postal Service increasing the rates charged to foreign EMS operators, so this only should have favorable impacts on the cost coverage for Inbound EMS 2.
