**MOTION OF THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE FOR TEMPORARY RELIEF  
CONCERNING GLOBAL EXPEDITED PACKAGE SERVICES – NON-PUBLISHED  
RATES 4 CUSTOMER CONTRACT WITH SERIAL NUMBER ENDING IN -0127  
(February 12, 2015)**

The contract with the serial number ending in -0127 that was filed in this docket is scheduled to expire on February 28, 2015.<sup>1</sup>

The Postal Service intends to initiate a new rate docket, in which the Postal Service would file a Global Expedited Package Services 3 agreement with the same customer. In the meantime, however, in accordance with Order No. 2017,<sup>2</sup> the Postal Service respectfully requests that the Commission approve a brief extension of the agreement that is the subject of this docket, to maintain continuity of pricing and other terms and conditions of the agreement. The Postal Service requests that the existing terms and conditions under the agreement that is the subject of this docket be extended until March 31, 2015, and that the Commission continue to list the agreement that is the
