**MOTION OF THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE FOR TEMPORARY RELIEF  
FOR GLOBAL EXPEDITED PACKAGE SERVICES -- NON-PUBLISHED RATES 4  
VERSION 2 CUSTOMER CONTRACT WITH SERIAL NUMBER ENDING: 0062  
(July 17, 2015)**

The contract with the serial number ending in -0062 that was filed in this docket is scheduled to expire on July 20, 2015.<sup>1</sup>

The Postal Service is negotiating with the customer concerning a Global Expedited Package Services – Non-Published Rates 7 agreement. Because of delays in processing the renewal agreement, in accordance with Order No. 2017,<sup>2</sup> the Postal Service respectfully requests that the Commission approve a brief extension of the customer agreement with the serial number NPR4.2-FY14-JUN14-M-T7-0062 until August 31, 2015.

A modification that would extend the agreement with the serial number ending in -0062 to August 31, 2015, has been presented to the customer. The Postal Service intends to file that modification in this docket once it has been signed. In the meantime,

however, in accordance with Order No. 2017, the Postal Service respectfully requests that the Commission approve a brief extension of the agreement that is the subject of this docket, to maintain continuity of pricing and other terms and conditions of the agreement. The Postal Service requests that the existing terms and conditions under the agreement that is the subject of this docket be extended until August 31, 2015.
