**MOTION FOR PARTIAL RECONSIDERATION OF ORDER NO. 2167**

(August 19, 2015)

In Order No. 2167, the Postal Regulatory Commission (Commission) included the agreement that is the subject of this docket in the Global Expedited Package Service 3 product in the Mail Classification Schedule.<sup>1</sup> This motion for partial reconsideration concerns the expiration date of the agreement that is subject of this docket.

On page 2 of Order No. 2167, the Commission noted that the agreement that is the subject of this docket is intended to take effect on September 1, 2014, and scheduled to expire on August 31, 2015. Similarly, on page 5 of the order, the Commission stated that “The contract is set to go into effect on September 1, 2014 and expire on August 31, 2015. Notice at 3.” In addition, on page 7 of the order, the Commission included “CP2014-69, expires August 31, 2015” as a change to the Mail Classification Schedule.

The United States Postal Service (Postal Service), however, in its initial notice, indicated that the expiration date of the agreement that is the subject of this docket would be September 30, 2015, rather than August 31, 2015. The Postal Service included the following statement on page 3 of its initial notice filed in this docket,

This additional GEPS contract is intended to become effective on September 1, 2014.... The agreement is to remain in effect for one calendar year from the Effective Date or the last day of the month that falls one calendar year from the Effective Date, whichever is later, unless terminated sooner pursuant to Article 13 or Article 14.

That statement was in accordance with Article 12 of the agreement that is the subject of this docket, which states the following.

**ARTICLE 12. TERM OF THE AGREEMENT**

The USPS will notify the Mailer of the Effective Date of the Agreement as soon as possible, but no later than thirty (30) days, after receiving the approval of the entities that have oversight responsibilities for the USPS. The Agreement shall remain in effect for one calendar year from the Effective Date or the last day of the month which falls one calendar year from the Effective Date, whichever is later, unless terminated sooner pursuant to Article 13 or Article 14.

Therefore, for the reasons discussed above, the Postal Service respectfully requests that the Commission reconsider the statements on pages 2, 5, and 7 of Order No. 2167, discussed in the second paragraph of this motion, which concern the expiration date of the agreement that is the subject of this docket. The Postal Service requests that the Commission resolve the issues related to the expiration date of the agreement that is the subject of this docket, and modify Order No. 2167 so that the order states that the expiration date of the agreement that is the subject of this docket is September 30, 2015, instead of August 31, 2015.
