ORDER APPROVING MODIFICATION TO
GLOBAL EXPEDITED PACKAGE SERVICES 3
NEGOTIATED SERVICE AGREEMENT

(Issued April 26, 2016)

I. INTRODUCTION

The Postal Service seeks to modify a Global Expedited Package Services 3 negotiated service agreement.¹ For the reasons discussed below, the Commission approves the Modification.

In Order No. 2671, the Commission approved the Global Expedited Package Services 3 negotiated service agreement (Existing Agreement).² On April 14, 2016, the Postal Service filed notice that it has agreed to the Modification to the Existing Agreement. On April 18, 2016, the Commission issued an order reopening this docket to consider the Modification, appointing a Public Representative, and providing interested persons with an opportunity to comment.³

The Postal Service intends for the Modification to become effective May 1, 2016. Notice at 1. The Postal Service filed supporting financial documentation and a certified statement, as required by 39 C.F.R. § 3015.5. *Id.* The Postal Service asserts that the Modification will not impair the ability of the contract to comply with 39 U.S.C. § 3633. *Id.* Attachment 2.

II. COMMENTS

Comments were filed by the Public Representative.⁴ No other person submitted comments. The Public Representative reviewed the Modification, the Existing Agreement, and the financial model filed under seal. PR Comments at 2. Based on that review, he concludes that the Existing Agreement, as modified, continues to be functionally equivalent to the baseline agreement, and should continue to generate sufficient revenue to cover costs. *Id.*

III. COMMISSION ANALYSIS

The Commission has reviewed the Notice, the accompanying materials filed under seal, and the comments filed by the Public Representative.

Cost considerations. The Commission reviews competitive product prices to ensure that each product covers its attributable costs, does not cause market dominant products to subsidize competitive products, and contributes to the Postal Service's institutional costs. 39 U.S.C. § 3633(a); 39 C.F.R. §§ 3015.5 and 3015.7. As long as the revenue generated by the product exceeds its attributable costs, the product is unlikely to reduce the contribution of competitive products as a whole or to adversely affect the ability of competitive products as a whole to contribute an appropriate share of institutional costs. In other words, if a product covers its attributable costs, it is likely to comply with 39 U.S.C. § 3633(a).

The Existing Agreement concerns only customized Priority Mail International service.⁵ The Modification adds customized Priority Mail Express International service as an option and amends Annex 1 (rates). Notice at 1.

Based on a review of the record, the Commission finds that the Existing Agreement, as modified, should cover its attributable costs. 39 U.S.C. § 3633(a)(2). For this reason, it finds that the Existing Agreement, as modified, should not result in competitive products as a whole being subsidized by market dominant products, in accordance with 39 U.S.C. § 3633(a)(1). Similarly, it finds the modified agreement is unlikely to prevent competitive products as a whole from contributing an appropriate share of institutional costs, consistent with 39 U.S.C. § 3633(a)(3). See *also* 39 C.F.R. § 3015.7(c). Accordingly, a preliminary review of the Modification indicates it is consistent with section 3633(a). The rate adjustment provision in section 14 of the modified agreement should allow the modified agreement's revenue to cover costs for the duration of its term. The Commission will continue to review the cost coverage of the modified agreement in its Annual Compliance Determination to ensure that rates cover costs.

Other considerations. The Postal Service states that the Modification shall become effective May 1, 2016. Notice at 1. The Existing Agreement, as modified, is set to expire September 30, 2016, unless terminated sooner.⁶

If the Existing Agreement, as modified, is terminated prior to the scheduled expiration date, the Postal Service shall promptly notify the Commission.

In conclusion, the Commission approves the Existing Agreement, as modified.

IV. ORDERING PARAGRAPHS

It is ordered:

1. The Commission approves the Global Expedited Package Services 3 negotiated service agreement, as modified.
2. The Postal Service shall notify the Commission if the Existing Agreement, as modified, terminates prior to the scheduled expiration date.
