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### PRC Releases Fiscal Year 2014 Annual Report

**Washington, DC-** Today the Postal Regulatory Commission issued its 2014 *Annual Report to the President and Congress*. It describes Commission activities of the last fiscal year and the extent to which regulations are achieving the objectives set forth by the Postal Accountability and Enhancement Act of 2006. These objectives, among others, include increased pricing flexibility, predictability in rates, and financial stability for the Postal Service.
